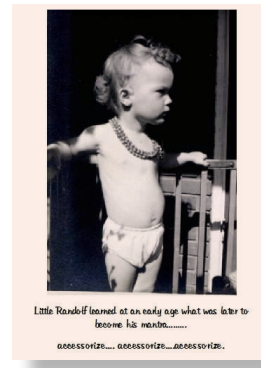
Margee Aycock new work and classes

The Tulsa World's new CrimeWatch website keeps readers updated on crime and public safety issues in the Tulsa area.

Visit the new CrimeWatch website at www.tulsaworld.com/crimewatch.

The site includes all of the following, produced by the largest news staff in Northeastern Oklahoma:

- Crime coverage – Read all of the stories, photos, features and breaking news reports on area crime, updated daily.
- Crime Tracker – Searches and maps crimes in your neighborhood reported to area police.
- Tulsa crimes are updated each month. The database includes all the crimes reported from Jan. 1, 2007, to the present. You can search by ZIP code, crime type or date range.
- CrimeWise – Aimed at keeping people informed about current crime trends and crimes that would be the most likely to affect them, their neighborhoods and places they frequent.
- Most Wanted – Features a fugitive wanted by Tulsa police.

- Meth busts – Searches and maps meth labs busted by area police.
- Bank robberies - Searches and maps bank robberies investigated by area police.
- Videos – Surveillance videos connected to area crimes, police press conferences and special reports created by our Tulsa World video staff.
- Resources – Links to all the police, jail and prison information and searchable databases, including who's recently been arrested and who is imprisoned.
- Special Projects – Exclusive analysis about Tulsa's homicides, including details on more than 1,000 homicides over the past two decades; and missing persons.

The site also includes all of the contact information for the Tulsa World's crime reporters and editors. Send in tips or contact the staff to suggest stories or crimes that you believe need to be followed up.

Heartbeat – Corner Installation –

Geoffrey Hicks thru July 31. Heartbeat is an interactive light sculpture made from 151 incandescent light bulbs, each hanging individually from the ceiling. The installation reacts to the heartbeat of individuals who are connected to the system and pulses with their energy. Dancers will perform underneath the sculpture with their heart rate controlling the speed, intensity, and size of the pulsing bulbs above.
