Little Known State Tax Refunds

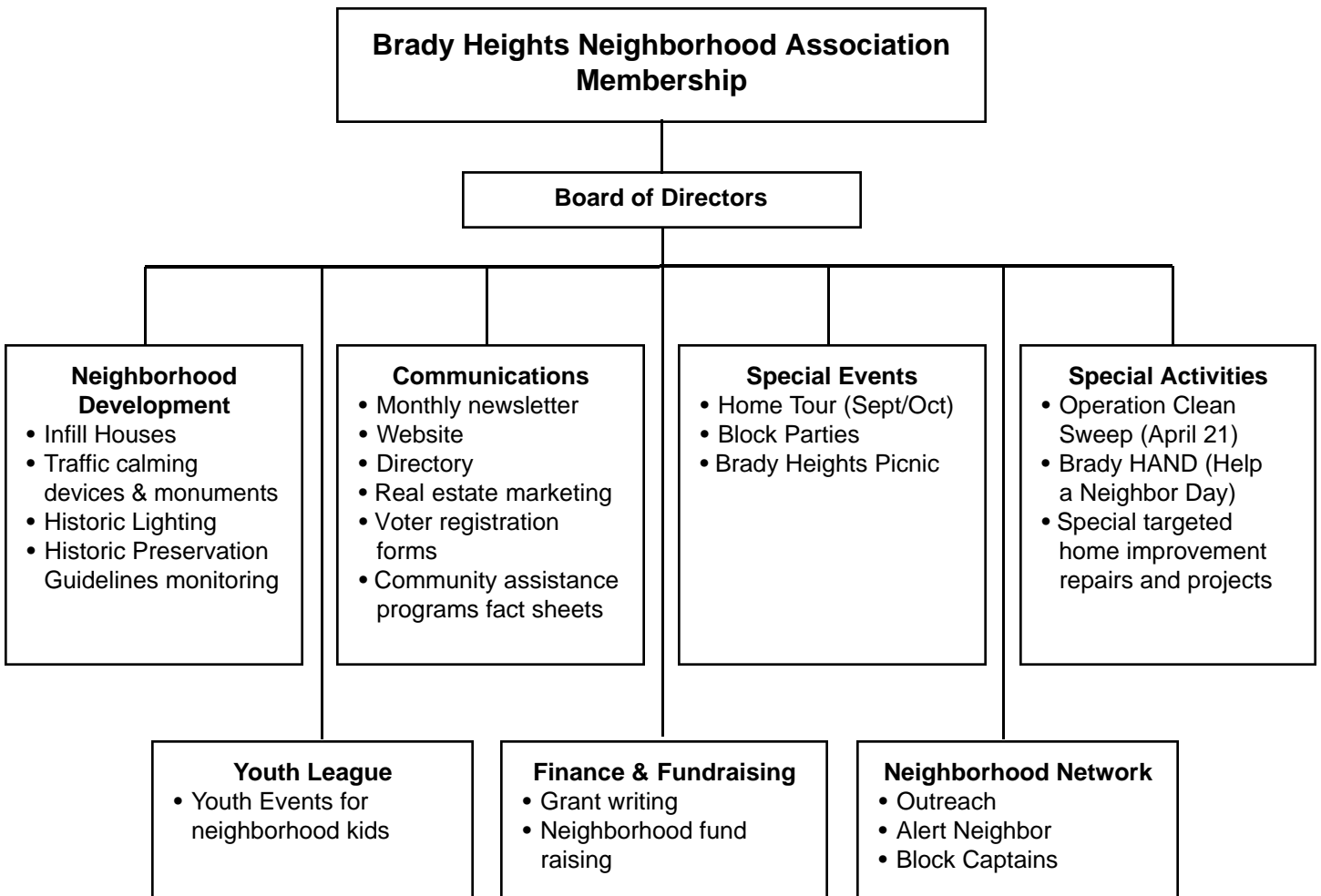

Did you know that you may be eligible for an Oklahoma sales tax refund and/or a property tax refund?

The sales tax refund is \$40 per person in your household. For example, a family of four would receive \$160.00. This refund has an income ceiling of \$20,000. Form 538-5 with instructions will help you determine if you are eligible. The deadline for filing for either the sales tax or the property tax refund is June 30.
